## Change to F-1 Visa Status



The information below will help you understand the process of changing from your current visa status to F-1 (student) visa status in the United States.

Although you can submit the change of status application on your own, we recommend seeking legal assistance for guidance on the change of status application and on the "bridge" application requirement. Also, we highly recommend returning to your home country and applying for an F-1 visa there. We see a much higher approval rate for students who apply for F-1 status in their home country.

## Changing to F-1 Status

The change of status application you will submit to the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) service center is a request to change from your current visa status to F-1 status. The status change will affect your current stay in the United States: it will allow you to study as a full-time student until you have completed your intended program of study. Approval of your request will not give you an F-1 visa. If you choose to leave the United States after your change of status has been approved, you must plan to apply for an F-1 visa at a U.S. consular post before you can return to the United States in F-1 status. If you already know that you will travel outside the United States within the next 6-9 months, changing status may not be a useful option. If your request is denied, USCIS will ask you to leave the United States as soon as possible.

## **The Application Process**

To begin preparing your application for F-1 status, please visit the <u>Study In The States webpage</u> on change of status. You should plan to prepare and submit all documents listed there. If your current visa status will expire more than 30 days prior to the first day of the quarter for which you applied, USCIS requires you to also submit a "bridge" application. Information on this requirement can be found on the <u>USCIS website</u>.

Within 2-4 weeks of submitting the change of status application, you should expect to receive notice from the USCIS service center confirming receipt of the application. If you do not receive notification within that time, please contact our office for guidance. Once the receipt notice has arrived, you may remain in the United States until USCIS makes a final decision on the change of status request. USCIS may contact you during this time for additional information needed to make a decision about your request.

## **Student Responsibilities During Change of Status Process**

During the change of status process, students should:

- Maintain full-time enrollment, beginning the quarter for which you applied, unless your current status does not allow you to pursue a program of study (for example, B1/B2 visa holders).
- Submit a <u>Deferral Request</u> to the International Admissions office by the first day of the quarter if the
  change of status has not been approved by the time the quarter begins. You must continue to submit
  deferral requests for each subsequent quarter until the change has been approved. If you do not, your
  SEVIS record may auto-cancel.
