

# Global Impact Application Guide

1. These trips will run only after reaching our minimum enrollment. Book your flights as refundable or with cancellation insurance (available with most credit cards) OR wait until you have received confirmation from Seattle Colleges Global Impact that the trip is a "go" before you book your ticket. Seattle Colleges typically knows for sure about which trips will run or if we need to do a cancellation by April 1. Sign up early so that your application will count toward this decision-making. If we need to cancel a trip, you will be offered the chance to switch a different trip or will have your deposit refunded.
2. There is a \$200 non-refundable application fee that must be included with your application form in order to reserve your place. Deadline for applications is June 1. This fee will be refunded if Seattle Colleges cancels the trip or you are not accepted into the program you applied to join. It will not be refunded if you do not receive a scholarship — or for any other reason. Please do not apply if you may not be able to participate due to funds.
3. Limited scholarship funding is available for Seattle Colleges students with a deadline of April 1, 2020. Students may be eligible to receive a [Gilman Scholarship](#) to fund their Global Impact trip. Please see your campus study abroad advisor for details and to apply.
4. Your final fees are due by or at orientation. No exceptions.
5. Participants are required to have emergency medical insurance (insurance which will cover you overseas and must include medical evacuation, repatriation of remains, and natural disaster and political evacuation. The District offers a subsidized rate with iNext insurance for \$48\* for the month surrounding your program.

*\*iNext prices vary for participants who are 60 and over.*
