To reflect on what they see and learn about life and work in an indigenous community



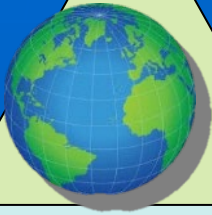
# Who goes on Global Impact Trips?

## **Clinical Healthcare**

medical /dental clinics,

readers/eyeglasses

## **Preventive Education**

nutrition, hygiene, pre-natal care, hand  
washing, screening, vaccines etc.

## **Public Health Infrastructure Development**

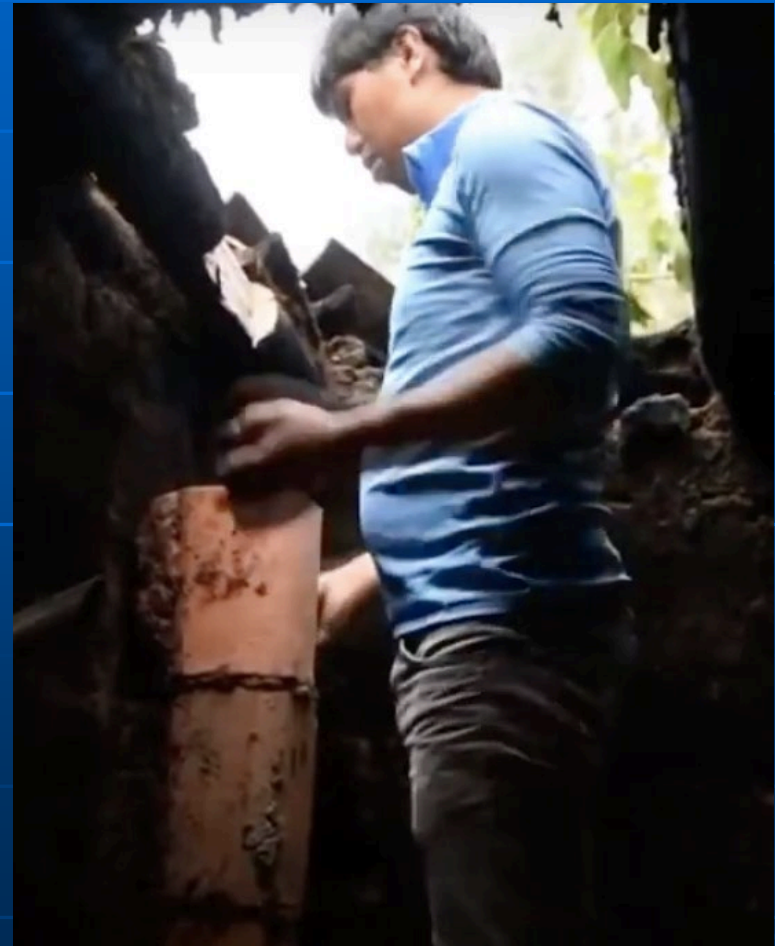
Refrigeration, water filters, clean-burning stoves,  
sustainable agriculture, construction of  
latrines/kitchens/clinics, green houses, composting, etc.



# What will you get from a Global Impact trip?

## volunteer goals

- Personal transformation
- Exposure to unusual experiences
- Amazing learning about cultural and socio-economic diversity
- Hands on learning about the importance of Public Health
- Seeing how people in poor communities live
- Learning how to communicate with non-English speakers
- Observing how to provide services to indigenous populations, including adaptation to culture and values
- The value of service to the local and global community
- Specific skills such as triage, teeth varnishing

# What does Global Impact cost?

- **Program Fee: \$1,995** includes the fees we pay our local partners to generate and implement the infrastructure projects, transportation, food and accommodation during the program/
- **Not included :**
  - International airfare to Cuzco
  - Overseas medical insurance (Global Impact has a discounted rate through iNext); \$48 for the month surrounding the program
  - Possible vaccinations (see your physician)
  - Visa (if needed)
  - Pocket money for souvenirs
  - Weekend trip to Machu Pichu (optional)
- **Scholarships!**
  - Seattle Colleges students: April 1 deadline; range from \$500 - \$1,500
  - Other scholarships may be available – talk to your Study Abroad Advisor now!
- **Deposit to keep your place : \$200** (becomes part of program fee)
- **Full Payment due June 20<sup>th</sup> 2022**

# How do you sign up for Global Impact?

- Sign up with an application and a \$200 deposit to save your place by June 1<sup>st</sup> 2022
- Apply for a scholarship by April 1<sup>st</sup> if you are a student at Seattle Colleges now or in the next quarters of the academic year
- Put the one day of Mandatory Orientation/Training on Saturday June 18<sup>th</sup> on your calendar!
