

Required Courses - College Bridge

College Bridge 4 (Introductory)

Introductory College Bridge Reading

This course focuses intensively on the reading, critical thinking, and participation skills needed to succeed in American colleges and universities at the introductory level (5 hours per week).

Introductory Academic Writing

This course develops and refines the student's ability to write effectively in an academic context at the introductory level (5 hours per week).

Academic Listening and Discussion

This course is designed for students who would benefit from further developing academic listening, note taking, academic vocabulary, class/group discussion, and critical thinking skills before progressing to Lecture Comprehension and Discussion.

Lecture Comprehension and Discussion

This course develops listening and comprehension skills for college lectures, note taking, and basic oral communication skills needed for college success (5 hours per week).

Two, Three, or Four-Credit College Class

Students choose from College Survival Skills (3 credit course, 3 hours per week) or a variety of college-level courses in Microcomputers (2-4 credits, 2-4 hours per week, plus labs).

College Bridge 5 (Intermediate)

Intermediate College Bridge Reading

This course focuses intensively on the reading, critical thinking, and participation skills that students need to succeed in American colleges and universities at the intermediate level (5 hours per week).

Intermediate Academic Writing

This course develops and refines the student's ability to write effectively in an academic context at the intermediate level (5 hours per week).

Lecture Comprehension (if not completed in CB4)

This course develops listening and comprehension skills for college lectures as well as note taking and basic oral communication skills needed for college success (5 hours per week).

Five-Credit College Class

Students choose from a selection of five-credit courses approved for College Bridge students.

College Bridge 6 (Advanced)

Advanced College Bridge Reading

This course focuses intensively on the reading, critical thinking, and participation skills that students need to succeed in American colleges and universities at the advanced level (5 hours per week).

Advanced Academic Writing

This course develops and refines the student's ability to write effectively in an academic context at the advanced level (5 hours per week).

Five-Credit College Class

Students choose from a wide variety of college-level social science, humanities, or science classes (5 hours per week).
